
“3-HOUR PARKING DISTRICT” ANNUAL PARKING PERMIT GUIDE

The City of Stuart “3-Hour Parking District” Annual Permit enables a resident to park a vehicle in certain 3 hour designated parking spaces, without being subject to a parking citation as referenced in City Code of Ordinances Section 40.44.


The permits are available only for those residents who lease or own personal vehicles that are registered within and who reside within the City’s 3-Hour Parking District (map attached). One (1) Annual Parking Permit may be issued to each resident driver’s automobile.

- A. To obtain an Annual Parking Permit, you must meet the following requirements:
 1. Provide a valid Florida Driver’s License with an address within the parking district;
 2. Provide a current vehicle registration for a vehicle registered in your name and at an address within the parking district; and
 3. Resolve any outstanding parking citations within the City of Stuart.
- B. Annual Parking Permits **are not valid** on **Osceola Street** (between St. Lucie Avenue and Haney Circle) or on **Flagler Avenue** (between St. Lucie Avenue and Confusion Corner).
- C. Annual Parking Permits **are valid** for the parking spaces within the 3-Hour Parking District, but **are not valid** for loading zones, fire lanes, handicap or other specially designated parking spaces.
- D. Annual Parking Permits **are valid** during posted times, Monday-Saturday, 8:00AM to 6:00PM. After 6:00PM, no permit is required.
- E. The Annual Parking Permit is specific only to the vehicle described on the application, and is not transferrable to another vehicle. If you obtain a new vehicle during the year, the old Annual Parking Permit will be voided. All parking permits shall be limited to the license plate of the registered automobile on file with the City of Stuart. Transferring the permit to a vehicle which is not on file with the City of Stuart shall result in an enhanced fine.
- F. Annual Parking Permit renewals occur in the month of January for current residents, and may be obtained throughout the year for new residents moving in. The Annual Parking Permit is not valid after the permit holder is no longer a resident of the 3-Hour Parking District.
- G. The Annual Parking Permit must be adhered to the rear window of the automobile on the lower portion of the **driver’s side of the vehicle**.
- H. **Violators are subject to a City Parking Citation. Any unresolved parking citations may result in the revocation of the permit and all related parking privileges until all fines and fees are paid in full.**
